We are located near the boundaries of several school districts and must honor the age requirements set by each one.

To be eligible for the three year old class, a child must be two years away from entering kindergarten in the district where he or she lives. Four year olds must be eligible for kindergarten in one year.

Classes

3-year olds: 3 by district cut-off date

T - Th ⇒ 9:00 to 11:30 am

Max. 38 children (2 classes of 19) with three teachers each class

4-year olds: 4 by district cut-off date

Mon -Wed-Fri ⇒ 9:00 to 11:30 am

Maximum 23 children with three teachers

4-year olds: 4 by district cut-off date

Mon-Wed-Fri ⇒ 12:30 to 3:00 pm

Maximum 23 children with three teachers

5 and older 4 year olds: 5 by January 31st

Mon -T - Th - Fri ⇒ 12:30 to 3:00 pm

Maximum 23 children with three teachers

A typical day includes:

- A balance of free play and structure
- Music
- Arts and crafts
- Flag salute and a simple prayer
- Lesson of the day
- Story time

- Playground time (weather permitting)
